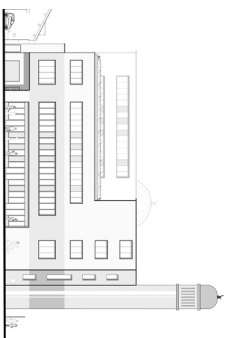


The Appeal

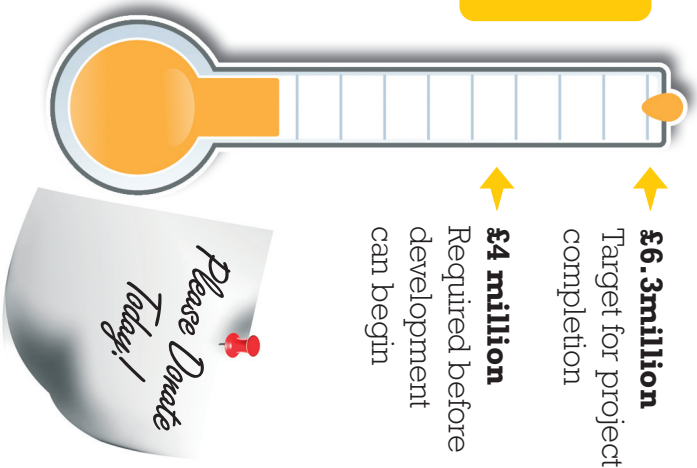

The History

- History of the centre dates back to the early 1980's when it established adult study circles and weekend classes for Islamic studies and Qur'anic teaching for children.
- In 1986 the then fledgling Muslim community of Ealing and Hanwell purchased a small property 119 & 121 Oaklands Road, and the first Masjid in the locality was established. This comprised of two shops that were modified to cater for both brothers and sisters.
- In 1996 by the Grace and assistance of Allah (swt), the community managed to secure the purchase of Brownlow House, a 14,400 sq. ft warehouse in Ealing.

Current Services

The Centre has a reputable standing and prominence for the welcoming, considerate and organised culture evident amongst the attendees and workers. Some of the centre's regular activities and services include:

- Adult Islamic study courses & multi-lingual circles
- Islamic counselling, marriage and inter-faith services
- Home of the popular Al-Kitab Bookshop available online at al-kitab.co.uk
- Adult gym & sports programme for brothers and sisters
- Mother & toddler group and active youth section with facilities
- Annual community fundays, summer school and Mosque open days
- Weekly Dawah tables in Ealing Broadway & Greenford
- Community chaplaincy & outreach in local hospitals & prisons
- Principal venue for weddings, community bazaars & training events

Current Position

- The Centre has played a central role in providing religious, social, recreational and educational facilities for the regional Muslim populace.
- Our community is growing. Currently the Masjid holds 1000 brothers and sisters for Jummah, with upto 200 praying in the car park.
- The building is dated, its condition is deteriorating and refurbishment is not a viable or cost-effective solution. A re-development is long overdue.

The Vision

- Demolition of the existing building and the construction of a new cost effective, environmentally friendly and efficient to maintain, 63,000 sq ft purpose built Centre able to accommodate 3,000 people, Insha'Allah.
- Extensive educational facilities for children and adults, both religious and national curriculum based. Other provisions to include:
Publicly accessible restaurant & bookshop • Fitness centre • Health room
Modern library • Dawah publication unit • Banqueting & conference facility
Funeral service • Children's crèche • Computer & skills resource centre
